

Compliance action taken for childcare provision

Summary of outcome

On 1 December 2010, we received information that raised concerns about the registration, which may impact on the care provided to children.

We received this information from a notification from the provider. The provider conducted an investigation and informed us of their findings.

We carried out an unannounced visit to the premises and found that the provider had taken action to comply with the requirements of registration. This included:

- improving the systems that are in place to safeguard children who have food allergies or special dietary requirements in line with the Early Years Foundation Stage Welfare Requirement Safeguarding and promoting children's welfare

We also found the provider had failed to notify us of significant events within 14 days. This is an offence under The Early Years Foundation Stage (Welfare Requirements) Regulations 2007. The provider confirmed they would notify us of such events in the future therefore we are taking no further action in respect of this.

The provider remains registered with Ofsted.

Publication of compliance action

We aim to ensure that the welfare of children and young people is protected in the services we regulate. The Childcare Act 2006 and accompanying regulations set out our responsibilities to regulate childminders and childcare providers. This includes the enforcement powers we have in relation to those

registered providers who do not comply with the requirements for registration.

We publish details of any actions we take, or the childminder or childcare provider takes to bring about compliance with requirements on our website for a period of five years commencing on the date we complete our investigation.
