

Compliance action taken for childcare provision

Summary of outcome

On 04 November 2011, the provider notified us that a child had left the premises unattended. The notification means that the provider met their legal responsibility as set out in the Early Years Foundation Stage welfare requirements to notify Ofsted of a significant event which is likely to affect the suitability of the early year's provider or any person who cares for, or is in regular contact with, children on the premises to look after children.

We carried out an unannounced visit to the premises and discussed the incident with the provider who gave us detailed information about the event and the actions they have taken.

The provider took prompt and appropriate action to comply with the requirements of registration by:
immediately ensuring that children were supervised at all times with staffing arrangements organised to meet the individual needs of children (The Early Years Foundation Stage General Welfare requirements – Suitable people)

ensuring staffing arrangements are effectively organised at drop off and collection times to ensure that children do not leave the premises unsupervised (The Early Years Foundation Stage General Welfare requirements – Safeguarding and promoting children's welfare).

We are satisfied that the provider took prompt and appropriate action to ensure they continue to meet the requirements for registration. As a result, we decided it was not necessary for us to take further action. The provider remains registered with Ofsted.

Publication of compliance action

We aim to ensure that the welfare of children and young people is protected in the services we regulate. The Childcare Act 2006 and accompanying regulations set out our responsibilities to regulate childminders and childcare providers. This includes the enforcement powers we have in relation to those registered providers who do not comply with the requirements for registration.

We publish details of any actions we take, or the childminder or childcare provider takes to bring about compliance with requirements on our website for a period of five years commencing on the date we complete our investigation.
