

Compliance action taken for childcare provision

Summary of outcome

On 11 August 2010, we received information that raised concerns about the registration, which may impact on the care provided to children.

We received this information from notification from the provider.

We carried out an unannounced visit to the setting and found the provider was not ensuring adequate supervision of children and the key person system was not being implemented effectively to support children's individual needs.

Following our investigation, we issued a notice to improve that asks the provider to:

provide evidence to demonstrate what steps are being taken to safeguard and promote the welfare of children and ensure they are never left unsupervised (The Early Years Foundation Stage General Welfare Requirements - Safeguarding and promoting children's welfare)

provide evidence to show effective systems are in place to ensure that all staff caring for children know the key person assigned to each child (The Early Years Foundation Stage General Welfare Requirements - Organisation).

We will monitor the provider to ensure the action is successfully completed. The provider remains registered with Ofsted.

Publication of compliance action

We aim to ensure that the welfare of children and young people is protected in the services we regulate. The Childcare Act 2006 and accompanying regulations set out our responsibilities to regulate childminders and childcare providers. This includes the enforcement powers we have in relation to those

registered providers who do not comply with the requirements for registration.

We publish details of any actions we take, or the childminder or childcare provider takes to bring about compliance with requirements on our website for a period of five years commencing on the date we complete our investigation.
